Snake's Alive...

As the weather in Western Australia heats up, so do the emergencies.

Our snakes are a wonderful part of the ecology of Western Australia, but they don't mix well with our pets. Snake bites are one of the more dangerous emergencies that we deal with as veterinarians, and quick action is needed to save the lives of affected pets.

Please be familiar with the snakes in your area, and what to do in the case of a bite.

Snake Bites:

5 Steps to Save Your Pet's Life

1. Remove your pet from contact with the snake. Confine your other pets to minimize exposure.
2. DO NOT try to catch the snake. This can be dangerous for you, and we don't need to identify the snake to treat with antivenom.
3. DO NOT kill the snake. Many of our snakes are protected, and it can also be dangerous to confront even a small snake. Call a snake catcher if the snake does not leave the area on its own.
4. Get to a vet immediately. Every minute is critical when trying to counteract snake venom, and waiting until you see signs can prove fatal.
5. If your pet shows signs (trembling, drooling, collapse) and seems to improve – still get to the vet. They often seem to improve, then become gravely ill.
